

Working near power lines can be extremely dangerous. Plan ahead if you are working around power lines.

SEVEN STEPS TO ELECTRICAL SAFETY

- 10 Metres to Safety. Stay back at least 10 metres or 33 feet from any downed power line, exposed underground cables or where there is contact with an overhead power line.
- Where's the Line. If you operate machinery or equipment that could come in contact with overhead or underground power lines, check for overhead power lines, or obtain underground locates (see #6) before beginning work.
- Know Your Limits. When operating machinery or equipment near power lines, always maintain the limits of approach: from three to seven metres or 10 23 feet, depending on the voltage. For proper safe working distances, contact Alberta Workplace Health and Safety at 1-866-415-8690. If your equipment COULD come closer than the minimum distances, contact ATCO (1-855-277-1670) before beginning work.
- Don't Hang Around Operating Equipment. Stay at least 10 metres or 33 feet away from equipment operating near power lines. The operator should be on the vehicle with everyone else clear of the vehicle when a boom is in motion. If you must approach, ensure the equipment is not operating.
- Shuffle or Hop, Don't Step. If the machinery you're operating contacts an energized line, move it away from the line to break contact. If this can't be done, remain on the machine. If there's a fire, jump out and land on both feet. Hop or shuffle, with your feet together, until you're out of danger (10 metres away). Ensure the heel of one foot never passes the toe of the other. Don't touch anything (machine or passengers) until you're clear. Call 911 or ATCO's electricity emergency line (1-800-668-5506), and wait until help arrives.

- 6 Call Before You Dig. Call Alberta One Call before you dig at 1-800-242-3447. If a cable is accidentally dug up, call ATCO immediately at 1-800-668-5506.
- Don't Become A Victim. Always call your local emergency services when someone is injured in an electrical accident. Keep everyone back, a minimum distance of 10 metres or 33 feet, and have someone call for help immediately.
